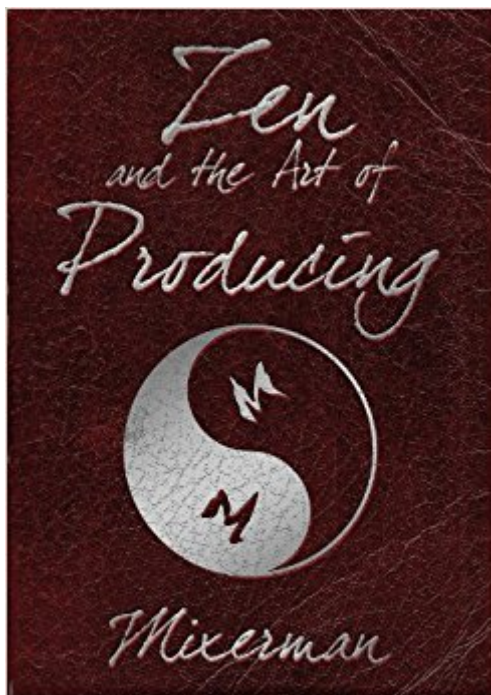

Zen and the Art of Producing is probably the best book I've ever come across on the topic of music production (I've read quite a few). With his witty, signature style more matured than ever, Mixerman takes the reader on a journey through the process of producing a record, complete with all of the "under-the-hood" thought processes and potential trappings that present themselves along the way. It, at once, teaches you limitless creativity and practical boundaries. And that is to say nothing of the treasure trove of leadership guidance presented on these pages. I would give this book a 10/10 for the provided leadership lessons alone.
