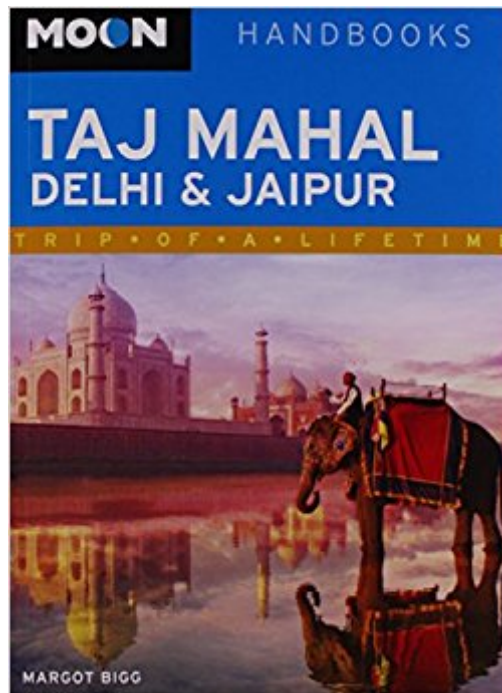




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Moon Taj Mahal, Delhi & Jaipur (Moon Handbooks)

During a three-month trip across India in 2005, Margot Bigg became mesmerized by the sheer diversity of the world's largest democracy, and decided to make it her home. A year later, she was living in Gurgaon, near Delhi, where she worked for a consultancy before joining the staff of Time Out Delhi and turning to journalism full time. She has since written for publications in India and abroad, including Rolling Stone, Outlook Traveller, The Caravan, Courier International, and The Oregonian. Margot's interest in other cultures started from an early age: Her best friends as a toddler were from Japan, Iran, and Jordan, and her baby talk was mixed with Japanese, Farsi, and Arabic (all of which she has since forgotten). I will be able to more fully critique this guide after we've visited India, but it helped us decide to focus most of our trip on Rajasthan. I love being able to jump to links via the e-book version.

Do not buy if you are not traveling with an organized tour. There is little or no information how to reach the train / bus stations. Also there are multiple bus stations in each city and the guide does not inform which station to go to for a specific destination. Most important, there is no mention that taxis are auto-rickshaws and that one has to bargain each time to take them. Taxis (cars) are not found on the streets and one can only book them through hotels or calling the radio taxi. The guide does not offer the number of the radio taxis. The maps are not accurate sometime. I found myself to walk a lot from the metro to a specific point when on the map looked pretty close. I would prefer to see less pictures on the guide (I am going there why do I need to see pictures?) and more details on transportation and maybe more maps. One example Vrindavan: from the guide it seems that the temples are all close to each other, but actually one needs to hire an auto-rickshaw because the temples are few kilometers from each other. More details on which temples are more interesting (for the guide) and where they are could improve the experience in Vrindavan. Remember that in India everyone tries to cheat you and it is impossible to trust drivers or hotels receptionists for transportation and locations.

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
