

As an avid reader of books in the "misery lit" genre, I was excited to stumble upon a new (to me) author. My most favorite stories are the ones written by the amazing foster carers in the UK. When I realized this was written by one of those amazing people, I immediately purchased this book and started reading. The story in itself, was heart wrenching, of course, but I chose to see the good the Scott family did for those two little bits, in the short and long term. If nothing else, for the first time in their lives, they felt love and goodness. The world needs more people like the Scott's so more children can experience that same feeling. All that said, I sadly had to give only 2 stars, and felt compelled to write this review, because the editing in this book is awful. I thought about putting it down more than once because of the grammar, but most importantly the flow and errors that were glaringly clear. First chapter, no, first page Jenny is mentioned by name but two paragraphs before she is one of two little girls. Statements were repeated, time lines were jumpy, and sentence structure often had me rereading for clarity. I'm about to purchase Mia, Lizzie Scott's second book, I'm hoping it is an easier read from a overall standpoint.
