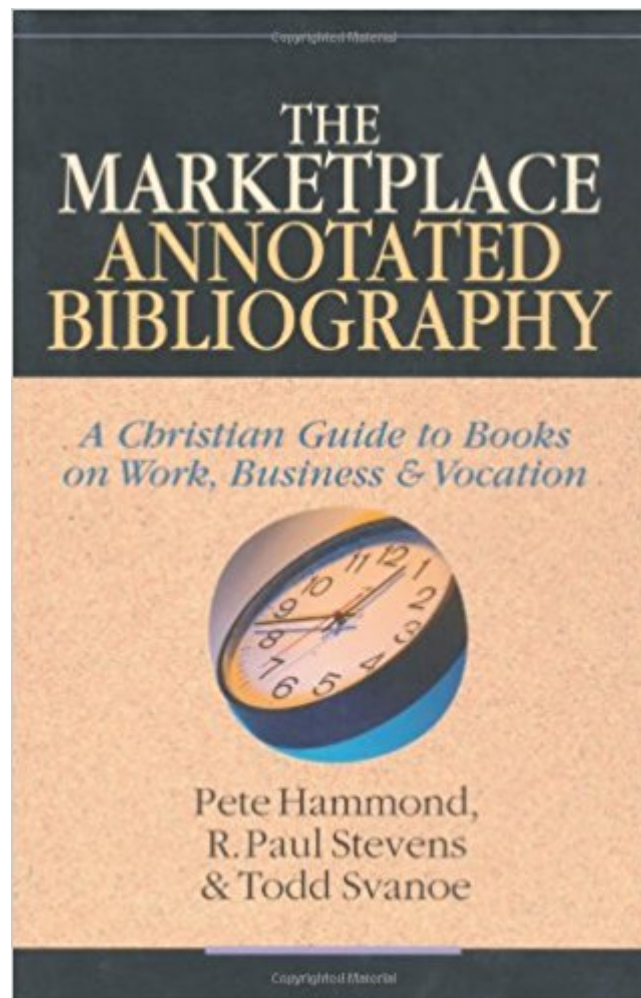




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# **The Marketplace Annotated Bibliography: A Christian Guide To Books On Work, Business & Vocation**
