

Colour Confidence In Embroidery (Milner Craft Series)

Apr/May 12 Stitching is a very practical craft and it can be done in a simplistic way. Sometimes a piece of work relies on the choice of stitches used to work it and sometimes the texture of the threads plays an important role. But the use of colour affects the piece more than anything else. To achieve a painterly shaded effect, long and short stitch is usually the stitch of choice, but elements such as the type of thread and the direction of the stitches contribute to the look of the finished embroidery. The rougher fibres of wool yarns such as crewel wool absorb more light so that little imperfections don't show, while smooth surfaces such as silk reflect the light and are less forgiving. In many ways, this book is as much about art as it is about stitching. The colour exercises are very effective and demonstrate the subtleties that shading can bring, adding light or shadows and sometimes making the highlights shine. Beautifully illustrated with clear photos, there are 12 projects, each of which focuses on a particular colour range, plus a glorious Sacred Kingfisher that uses all of the techniques - and is a challenge for more advanced stitchers... or perhaps for stitchers

who have worked their way through the exercises and other projects in the book. This book really puts the 'art' into embroidery and teaches you all you need to know about 'painting' with a needle and thread. Stitch

Trish Burr's "Colour Confidence in Embroidery" is the only book you will need to find your way through colors and a feeling of understanding of how colors work together. The book has bright colorful pages with instructions on how to embroider birds and flowers. The instructions are clear. A person might need some idea on how to embroider other wise might appear to be complicated. There are several chapters regarding how to use color and blend color with fantastic examples of what colors blend with each other. I would recommend this book.

I would recommend Trish Burr's book Colour Confidence in Embroidery to anyone interested in the needle arts. Although this book is written specifically for the needle work artist the information on color can be utilized by any working artist in other media. It is not a beginners book on needle painting but she does go over the basics in the beginning of the book with excellent diagrams along with information on materials and equipment. The color wheel is broken into segments (cool/warm colors, complementary colors etc.) and relates to how this works in creating a stitched piece. Every page has excellent color photos. Every combination of color shading has a photograph of the stitched sample along with the thread numbers listed. There is a section on color schemes and the back of the book contains the sample projects. These projects enforce the color theory discussed in the front of the book. The projects include line drawings, finished color photo of the piece. stitch

diagrams as well as specific color insets for visual assistance in the stitching of leaves, petals, stems etc..

Color is so important to any successful fiber composition, and Trish Burr provides a very useful handbook that shows color combinations that are easy to apply to your own projects. She also gives specific DMC brand numbers for thread, if you are looking to replicate the colors exactly, but it's easy enough to match the swatches to other brands of thread to get a good match. She talks about basic concepts, such as complementarity, and gets you started understanding more about color theory. To really learn about color, I have found other book more useful (book about the Quiller color system, for example). But this is a good guidebook, specifically tailored for hand embroidery people. If you'd like pictures of color schemes that you can match and don't want to think too much about developing your own, this is a good book for you.

If you want to take your embroidery art to a finer level this book is a must-have. Beautiful, full color photographs with projects for each color group are provided. Created specifically for the DMC stranded cotton floss range (but you could find charts online that would give you color equivalents if you work with floss by another major manufacturer).I had always wondered how subtle color blending was done and now I know ! Working my way from one color group to another will certainly give me a deeper understanding of how shading and shaping of images is done just using threads. A wonderful reference book and learning tool.
