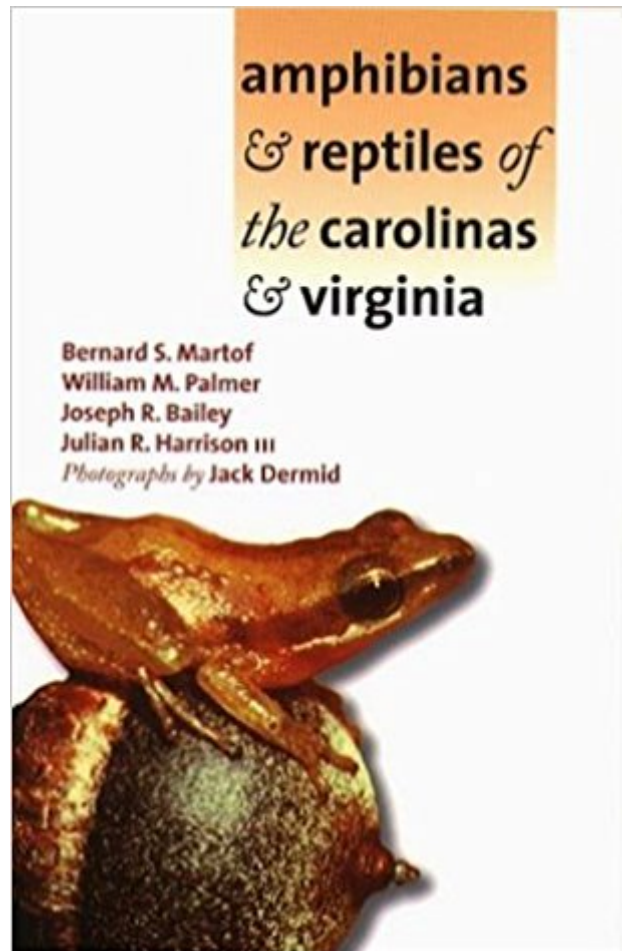

Excellent book! It's a little more detailed than a typical field guide but what I like most about it is that it's specific to our area. So, while I have a larger field guide (for the region) I also really love having this one because it's more focused. In the beginning of the book there's an introduction to habitat with great pictures showing what the habitats look like. The book then goes into the specific species - I was particularly interested in the salamanders and amphibians but the sections on snakes, turtles and lizards are super too. The pictures are great, descriptions cover approx. size, colors/patterns, species that they could be confused with, habitats, and egg laying (timing, incubation etc). Great book to have on hand.

I've had and used this book since it came out in 1980. I always recommend it to all of the classes and seminars I give on reptiles and amphibians and to all of the people who ask for a good field guide because, for the size and cost, there are none better for this part of the country. Well worth the money if a handy, accurate, well-done field guide with great photos and range maps is what you want.

Like another reviewer, I've had a copy of this book since the 80s. As a kid, I practically memorized this book, and I still think it's the finest field guide I own. This book's coverage of the most common species is quite thorough. The style and presentation are also excellent, so aspiring field guide writers should take notice.
